

Asarina scandens 'Joan Lorraine'

Geographic Origin:

Garden.

Plant Group:

Vines.

Hardiness:

Sunset zones: 17-24 as perennials, 1-16 as annual.

USDA zones: 9-10.

Heat zones: 12-10.

Mature size:

Height: 4-8 feet tall (1.8-2.4 m).

Flowering period:

Late spring through summer if sown early enough.

Flowering attributes:

Tubular, snapdragon-like, dark purple flowers, with white throats.

Leaf attributes:

Alternate, heart to arrow-shaped, bright green leaves.

Light:

Tops in full sun, feet in shade.

Soil:

Fertile, humus rich, well-drained soil.

Feeding:

Fertilize once a month with a [complete organic fertilizer](#), throughout the growing season.

Propagation Methods:

Sow seed in February for flowers the first year and keep seed pots at 55-64°F (13-18°C).

Germination in three weeks. | Root softwood cuttings in late spring and non flowering shoots in late summer.
